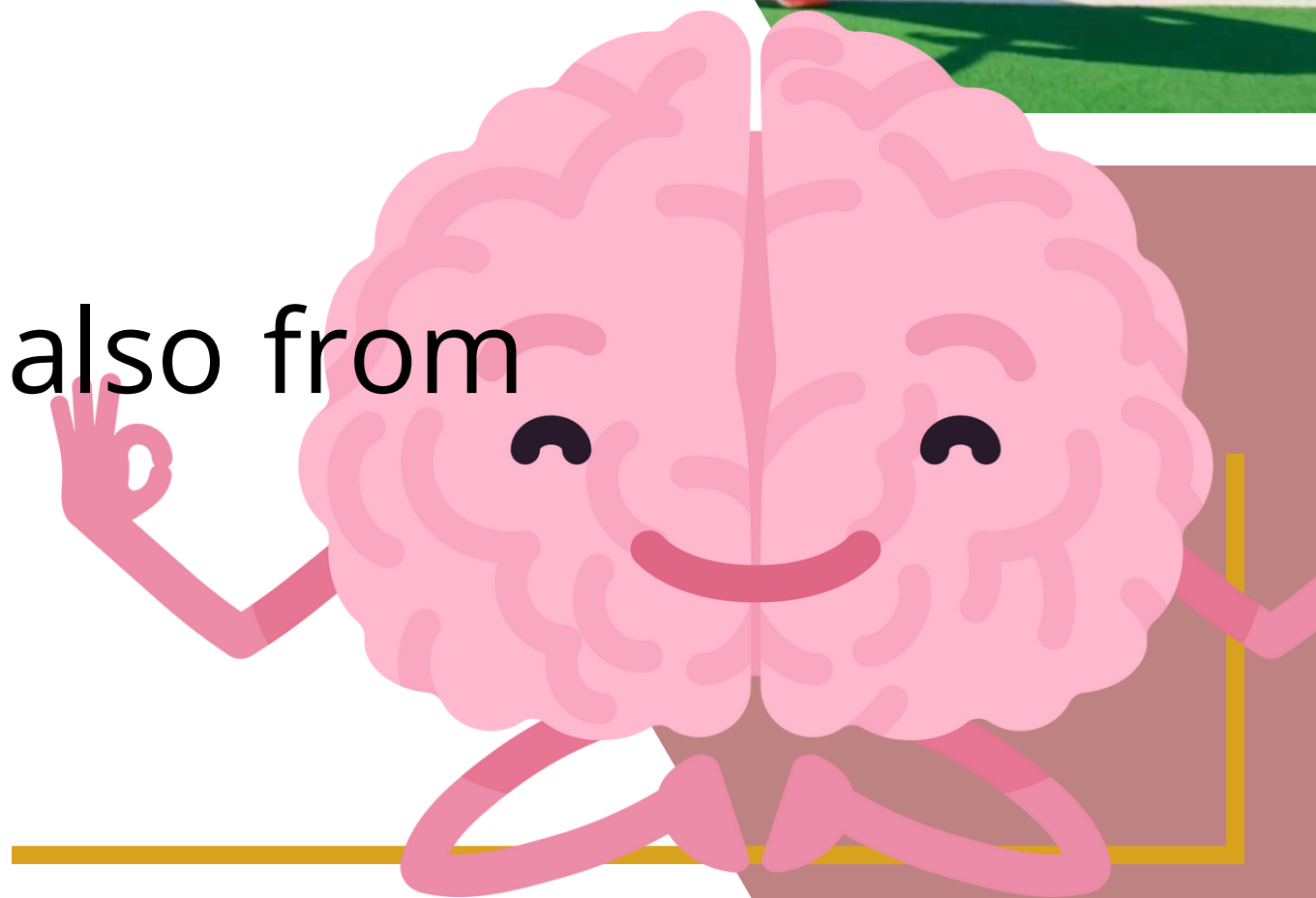

- There are supports here in school and also from outside agencies, please do reach out




Homework and Study in 6th Year

- **Apprenticeships talk on 14th November**

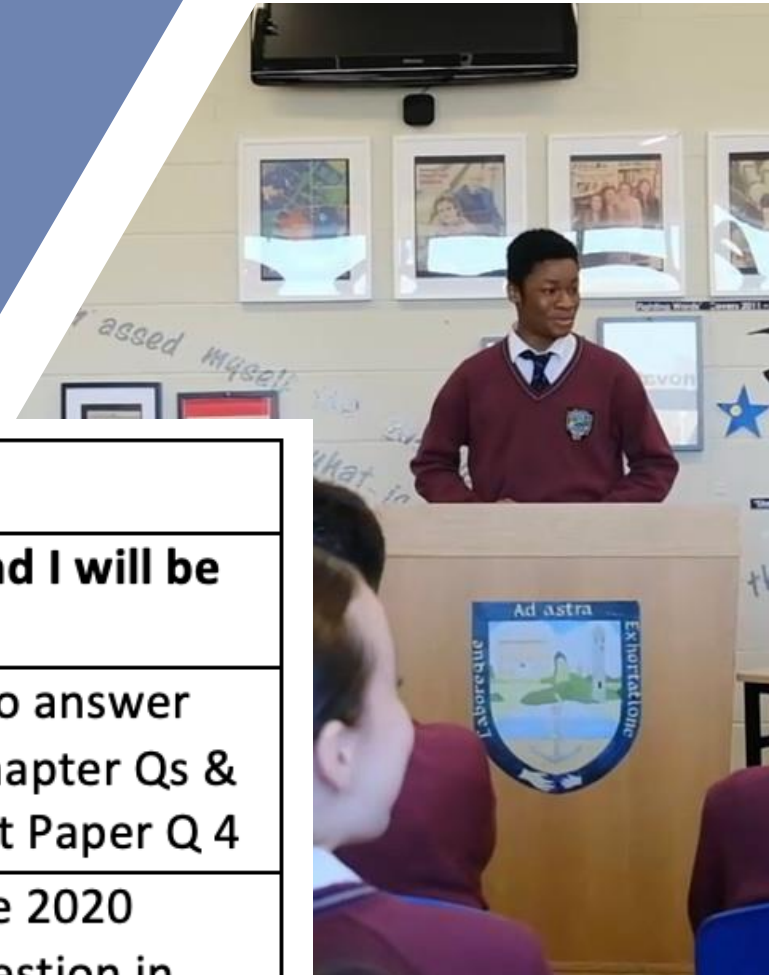


- PLCs offer a QQI certification.
- PLC courses can also serve as an alternative way of [accessing a third level degree](#) course with almost 20% of all CAO applicants presenting a Level 5 or Level 6 PLC award to access these opportunities.



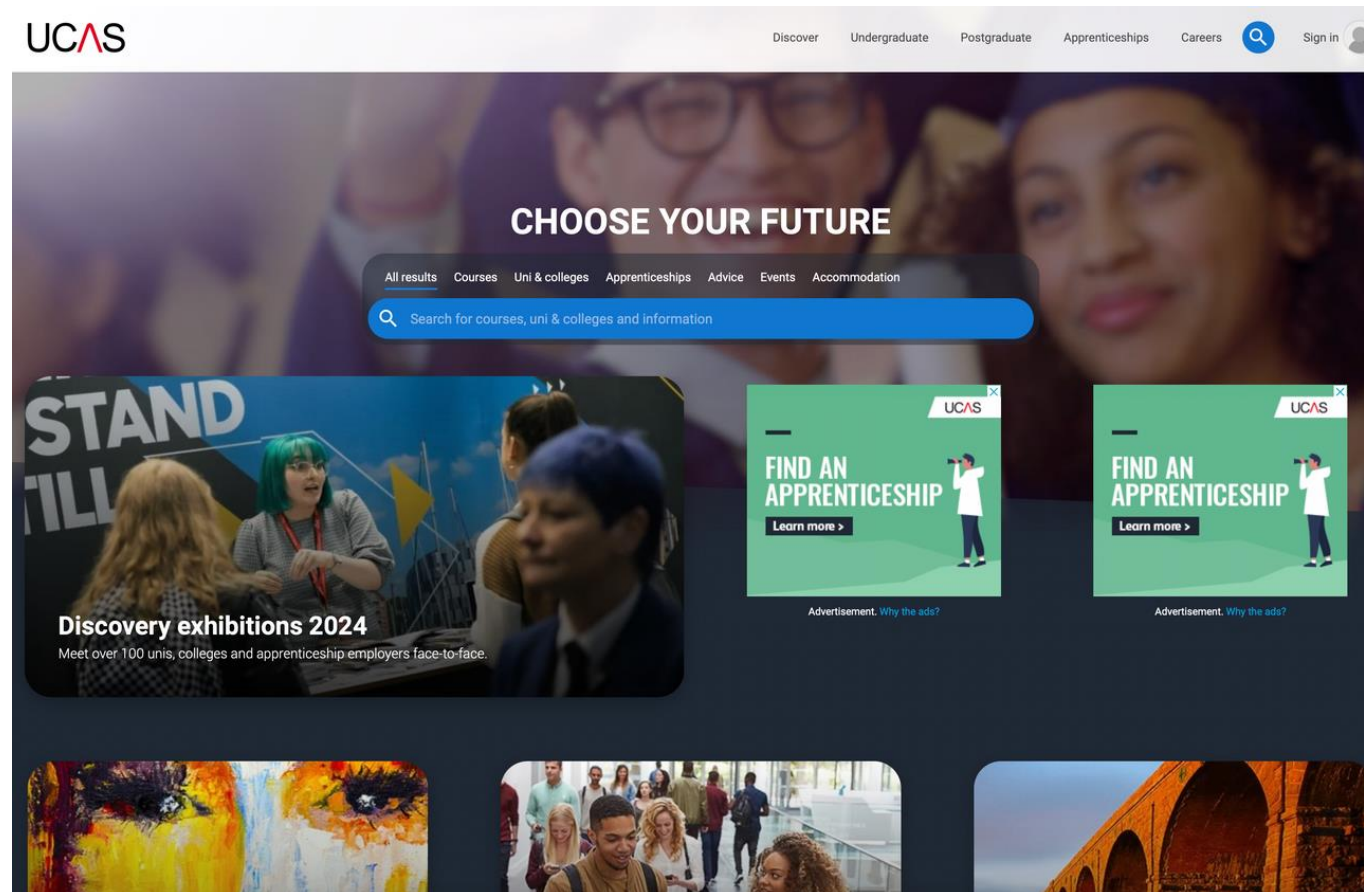
